NALUPEMBE FALLS

LOCATION

The site is located in Kalundu Village in Mwenda Chiefdom, Chipili District on Mumbwe River in Luapula Province. The site is situated at latitudes and longitudes -10.728720S, 29.093417E (10°43'43.4"S, 29°05'36.3"E) and 10.729484°S, 29.09442E (10°43'46.1"S, 29°05'39.9"E) respectively, and covering a total area of 342,109.73m<sup>2</sup>.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site is the largest and most scenic waterfall in Chipili District. The site is located a few meters downstream of the Mumbwe River Bridge crossing in the heart of Chipili Township.

BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

The boundary of the site runs from Point A on the northern-eastern bank of Mumbwe River and in a south-easterly direction to Point B near a bush track and further to points C, D and E near the main road at the bridge; thence cutting through the Mumbwe River taking a south-westerly direction to Point F on the southern side of the Mumbwe River; thence in a north-westerly direction to Points G, H and I and in a north-easterly direction to Point A the starting point after cutting through the Mumbwe River.

The described area is in extent of 342.1 hectares.

The described area is shown on a plan marked red, signed by the Surveyor-General and deposited in the office of the Surveyor-General and the National Heritage Conservation Commission, Lusaka.
