**The Public-Private Partnership (Kasumbalesa Border
Post) (User Fees) Regulations, 2014**

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section *sixty-six* of the Public-Private Partnership Act, 2009, the following Regulations are made:

| 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public-Private Partnership (Kasumbalesa Border Post) (User Fees) Regulations, 2014. | Title |
| 2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
“abnormal load” has the meaning assigned to it in the Public Roads Act, 2002;
“Commissioner-General” has the meaning assigned to it in the Zambia Revenue Authority Act;
“customs area” has the meaning assigned to it in the Customs and Excise Act;
“user fee” means a charge payable for a vehicle for a single border crossing into or out of the Republic, whether loaded or empty;
“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it in the Road Traffic Act, 2002. | Interpretation

| 3. The Commissioner-General shall be responsible for the collection of user fees under these Regulations. | Administration of Regulation |
| 4. The fee payable in respect of each vehicle crossing into or out of the Republic, whether laden or empty, whether with an abnormal load or not, shall be as set out in the First Schedule. | User fee |
| 5. The fee payable for parking in a customs area beyond forty-eight hours after the release of a vehicle from customs control shall be 25 United States Dollars per day or part of the day. | Parking fee |
| 6. Subject to the other provisions of these Regulations, an exemption from the payment of the crossing fee shall be granted in respect of vehicles listed in the Second Schedule. | Exemption |

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Regulation 4)

USER FEES

<i>Description</i>	<i>Rate Per Crossing</i>
Passenger Vehicle/Buss	25 United States dollars or kwacha equivalent
Commercial truck of 2 axles and above	100 United States dollars or kwacha equivalent
Trucks carrying abnormal load	150 United States dollars or kwacha equivalent

SECOND SCHEDULE

(Regulation 6)

EXEMPT VEHICLES

<i>Description</i>	<i>Condition for Grant of Exemption</i>
Government vehicles for the Republic of Zambia and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)	Subject to display of Government licence plates
Diplomatic vehicles	Subject to display of diplomatic licence plates
Vehicles owned by Government employees who are officially appointed and deployed to serve at the Kasumbalesa border post	Subject to proof of ownership and prior registration
Non-commercial vehicles owned and driven by members of the frontier communities (Zambia-DRC)	The community must reside within the proximity of the border subject to pre-registration and specified terms and conditions
